He does nothing in vain. Amen.

"The time is now the Kingdom is here repent and believe." Mark 1:15

The time is now - this is God's time, now, not when we die . . . not when we get older, not when we have it all figured out or when we meet the right person or get the right job or become parents, **no**, the time is now where ever we are, God is here.

This is Jesus's proclamation in Mark's Gospel. When he engaged and reached out to people to share a simple truth, that the time is now; so be present to it. Be open to it, don't wait for "something" to come, be present to the now. Try not to spend so much time and energy worrying about the future or reliving the past . . . be present, fully present to the now. . . this is true in many religious traditions and shared by so many spiritual teachers . . . if we are present to the now, God is here. That's Kairos, that's God's time. The time is now, the Kingdom is here. The Kingdom is in the here and now, it's around us, within, and amongst us. God meets us disguised as our life; in the everyday, in the moments, the little miracles, the whispers of grace. God uses all things . . . God is in all things.

The time is now the Kingdom is here, repent and believe. So what do we have to do to experience this truth – simple, we have to change. We have to "Repent", Metanoia which means "change your mind" or as I like to think about it, change your heart and mind. It's like that quote from Wayne Dyer, "when you change the way you look at things, the things you look at change". Metanoia, repent... change and then believe.

To change, we must believe or more foundationally, "trust". We have to trust, which is hard in the world we live in. Our world is riddled with mistrust, we live with fear and anxiety and worry. We may often feel like we can't trust anybody, governments or politicians, the media, businesses, people themselves even the church at times. We are left questioning and we are left with doubt . . . its hard, but that's the invitation and trust involves, letting go. It involves stepping off into the abyss or into the unknown. Trust involves embracing wonder and awe and things that can't always be explained but we know are real none the less. Intangible things, intuitive things like love and joy and hope, sadness, pain and hurt but also forgiveness and healing, and peace . . .all quite real.

Jesus calls Simon, Andrew, James and John to leave their Nets, to leave their old life, their old selves, their external or ego selves so they can follow. Now that's what I call Metanoia, change. Jesus certainly calls them to leave their comfort zone and enter something new. Jesus calls them to trust in this invitation and to trust that they are not alone; doesn't he call us to the same? Jesus calls us to trust that we to are not alone, that God is with us, that the time is now, that the kingdom that we can co-create, is here . . . we simply have to let go and be open to change while trusting in the process.
