

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, which translates from Latin to "Body of Christ." This feast originated in France in the midthirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist & the Church. The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the *Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it.* The 2nd focus is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head. This image helps keep in focus both the unity and the diversity of the Church.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others. Catholic News Agency.

Draw close to Jesus in the Eucharist

VATICAN CITY - "We cannot be good Christians if we do not remain in Jesus. With him, though, we can do everything," the pope said.

"Attached to Christ, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and in this way we can do good to our neighbour, to society, to the church,"

The pope reflected on the Gospel reading (Jn 15:1-8) in which Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing."

Jesus presents himself as the true vine to which his disciples can remain united when they abide in him and vice versa.

It is an active, reciprocal relationship because branches "need sap to grow and to bear fruit; but the vine, too, needs the branches, since fruit does not grow on the tree trunk."

"It is a question of a reciprocal abiding so as to bear fruit. We abide in Jesus and Jesus abides in us,". Christians must be united to Christ and remain in him before they observe his commandments and the beatitudes, and before performing works of mercy because "we cannot be good Christians if we do not remain in Jesus,".

However, Jesus also needs disciples, "he needs our witness," Pope Francis said.

The task of all Christians as Christ's disciples "is to continue to proclaim the Gospel in words and in deeds" so that the fruit that is borne may be borne out of love.

A fruitful life, the pope said, depends on prayer in which one asks to see, think, feel and act like Jesus in order to love others and "bring to the world fruits of goodness, fruits of charity, fruits of peace."



"We have asked you to intercede for us with your Son Jesus. Every day, holding in our hands the crown of the holy rosary, we have turned our eyes to you, Mother of Mercy, begging that the pandemic may end and humanity may resume its daily life with greater security." The Pope prayed.

"Tonight we gather before you, our Virgin Mother, venerated in this image as the one who unties knots. In fact, there are many knots that bind our lives and our activities. They are knots of selfishness and indifference, economic and social knots, knots of violence and war."

"We pray to you, Holy Mother, untie the knots that oppress us materially and spiritually, so that we may joyfully bear witness to your Son and our Lord, Jesus Christ."

The rosary marked the conclusion of a worldwide prayer marathon launched on May 1 at St. Peter's Basilica. The intentions included the rediscovery of the value of community life, relief from unemployment, an end to domestic violence, recovery from illness, and the resumption of daily pastoral ministry.
