

I think if Jesus came to do one thing, he came to heal, which meant more than just physical healing, it meant restoring someone to their community, healing what was broken in their relationship with themselves, others and God. In fact the root of the word salvation means "to heal" and in the Jewish context this "healing" involved freeing someone from their perceived sin.

Jesus heals two people, a woman and a little girl. So as you read this healing story, what do you find yourself thinking about or focusing on? Are you drown to the woman who had been bleeding for 12 years, or the daughter of the local synagogue official, who had died? I am drawn to the woman because of her courage, her faith or ability to believe and trust. She approaches Jesus in secret, knowing that she is an outsider and seen as unclean, she tries to get to him without anyone noticing her. As Jesus crosses her path she makes a quick and bold decision. I can feel the hope rising within her that maybe, just maybe this man might be able to help her?? If you have ever been in pain for an extended amount of time, you know how all consuming it can be to try and deal with it, this woman has been suffering for 12 years, so I can only imagine how exhausted she was. She hears that Jesus, is in town, hope somehow rose from within. Out of this hope, a bold decision was made to believe, that if only she were to touch the edge of Jesus' cloak, she would be healed. She was right, but the encounter didn't end there. Jesus now reaches out to her and again she shows great courage and belief. She trusted what rose within her. She trusted the hope that called her to make this bold choice and she trusted that the power that healed her, manifested through this man, would truly see her.

Risking public humiliation, shame, condemnation, she came forward when Jesus stopped and asked "who touched me"? Because she came forward, her healing, at first physical, was made complete. By coming forward and meeting Jesus, by encountering him and allowing him to encounter her, she was touched and made whole: spiritually, emotionally, physically and socially she was healed . . . "Daughter" he says, how intimate, "your faith" . . . Your belief. . . Your trust, openness and courage . . . Have made you well.

How beautiful this encounter is, how it invites me in, may it invite you in as well. May it help you reach out boldly to touch Jesus and let him touch you and bring healing where you need it in your life.
