

This month's feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 15) invites us to contemplate the deep mystery of Mary's own faith as she responded to God's call, as challenging as it was, to become the Mother of God. The feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord (August 6) recalls the miraculous way in which Jesus revealed his divinity on Mount Tabor, thereby reminding us that all things are truly possible with God.
