


Clothe yourself with Patience

Does a caterpillar hurry to spin a cocoon? Never! A caterpillar is patient. Does a butterfly hurry to break out of its cocoon? No. A butterfly is patient. Does a bud open before it feels the warm rays of the sun? No. A bud waits patiently. Does a bird hurry in building its nest? No. A bird builds patiently, twig by twig, until the nest is completed.

The Beatitudes jar our sensibilities. Those who are poor, hungry, weeping, or persecuted are called blessed. This is, indeed, a Gospel of reversals. Those often thought to have been forgotten by God are called blessed. In the list of "woes," those whom we might ordinarily describe as blessed by God are warned about their peril. Riches, possessions, laughter, reputation . . these are not things that we can depend upon as sources of eternal happiness. They not only fail to deliver on their promise; our misplaced trust in them will lead to our demise. The ultimate peril is in misidentifying the source of our eternal happiness.

The Beatitudes are often described as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. We are challenged to examine our present situation in the context of our ultimate horizon, the Kingdom of God. Loyolapress.com
