

Humility is a virtue that is often misunderstood. We associate humility with lowering ourselves—perhaps even berating ourselves. But humility is nothing more or less than *being* ourselves, as we really are. The reason we associate humility with self-"lowering" is because we tend to do the opposite. We hold ourselves higher than we were ever meant to stand. We set ourselves up as our own authority and determine right from wrong based on our feelings or desires. We blame others for our mistakes. We strive for affirmation and feel crushed when it does not

come. Humility is different. Humility helps us recognize that we are not our own person: everything we have and are is from God. We receive our identity only in relationship with God and, through God, with others. What does a humble heart look like? Father Giuseppe Forlai offers this:

—To live without fear in the paradox of what we are—persons "full of grace" but "who count for nothing," bearers of a treasure in earthen vessels.
—To celebrate our failures as if they were triumphs, seeing, as Mary did, from Calvary's heights the faint but certain light of Easter.

-To know how to look at the past with its blessings, and not accuse others of faults for which we are responsible.

-To desire that others might know our sins, realizing that only when we are stripped even of honor can we say that we have touched, like Mary, the humble flesh of the Son of God.

Mary, Mother of Apostles, teach us to see ourselves and others through God's eyes and grow in humility of heart. In Christ, *Daughters of St. Paul*
