

On Nov 1 and 2, we celebrated All Saints Day and All Souls Day which, traditionally, invites us to reflect on our place in the larger reality of life and death, and to give hope in the eternal life with God. Throughout this month, Catholics remember and pray for their loved ones who have passed away. Whether your loss is more immediate and you are struggling with feelings of grief, loss and hopelessness, or if you are simply commemorating special anniversaries of loved ones who died a while ago.

"Book of Life"

As a parish, we will highlight this month by preparing our annual "Book of Life". You are invited to place the names of your departed family and friends. Praying for the dead is an act of charity and an occasion to meditate on God's mercy. These prayers also move us to assess our own relationship with God and consider how God is calling us to follow him more closely, so we can spend eternity with him. Love continues after death. For this reason, prayers have been offered for the dead since the beginning of Christianity. The Church teaches that God's mysterious will involves the prayers of the faithful in the purification of our loved ones, friends, and even strangers after their death. We offer suffrages for the dead-Masses, prayers, and almsgiving-because we love those who have died. And God uses our simple acts of love to prepare the souls of the deceased who are destined for heaven. 
