

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

(inspired by Exodus 20, Psalm 19, John 2: 13-22) With hearts of sorrow, we come before you, O God, to confess what you already knowwe have failed to keep your laws. Again and again, we have followed our own selfish will, rather than your holy and life-giving will for our lives. We have twisted your decrees and institutions to suit our preconceptions and interests rather than your own. Forgive us, O God, and cleanse us from hidden faults, that the words of our mouths, and the meditations of all our hearts, may be acceptable to you, our Rock and our Redeemer.
