

This Lent **** Jesus knows the burdens you carry, the way of the passion that you walk and he doesn't want you to walk alone. He sees you. He invites you into his divine and mysterious plan. "Come to me." Whatever are the tears that run down your cheeks, or those perhaps held unshed in the secret of your heart, go to him.

Jesus is calling you from the Tabernacle and from the inner sanctuary of your own heart.

"I am here. Come to me. Tell me what you need."

Fasting is the most well-known, and most commonly misunderstood, practice associated with Lent. Almost everyone has heard about "giving something up" for Lent. But it's more than just that. The idea behind Lenten fasting is to deny satisfaction of a physical need or desire in order to devote that time to prayer, reflection, and service. This fasting is meant to parallel the 40 days Jesus fasted in the wilderness in preparation for his public ministry. Fasting most often involves abstaining from food of a particular type, such as meat or sweets, or at a particular time. For example, many people are familiar with the practice of not eating meat on Fridays during Lent. Yet, fasting can also include staying off social media, not watching television, or not playing video games. A couple may agree to abstain from sexual intimacy as a fast, and use that time together to seek intimacy with God through prayer. Most people choose not to fast on the intervening Sundays throughout Lent, as these are days of celebrating Christ. Fasting during Lent helps Christians reflect on their need for the cross and prepare their hearts for the celebration of the resurrection.

Through the Desert God Leads us to Freedom In his message for Lent 2024, Pope Francis invites us: 'Let us welcome Lent as the great season in which he reminds us: "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery (Ex 20:2). Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom. Jesus himself was driven into the desert by the Spirit in order to be tempted in freedom. For forty days, he stands before us and with us: the incarnate Son. Unlike Pharaoh, God does not want subjects, but sons and daughters. The desert is the place where our freedom can mature in a personal decision not to fall back into slavery. In Lent, we find new criteria of justice and a community with which we can press forward on a road not yet taken."

Watch: Lent series fearless

Jesus asks an important question upon seeing a man who had been ill for 38 years, Jesus dares to question him: *Do you want to be well?*

It seems like a silly question on the surface. But as Jesus probes the depths of this man's desire, he also invites us to look at our own.

What do you want? Really want? And does your desire align with the profound longing that God has written into your being: the longing for union with him? Desire is a powerful force in our lives. When we desire God and the will of God, the force of holy desire moves us to act accordingly. When we don't allow ourselves to desire rightly or deeply enough—when we jump to satisfy the smallest craving and don't let ourselves experience a deeper hunger—then we, too, can find ourselves sitting in the same spot for years. The spiritual life isn't complicated. Jesus can take us to new places with a simple question: Do you want to be well? Do you want to experience true freedom? Do you want to dwell in me and let me dwell in you? All of the teachings and practices of the Church are given to the world in order to heal the pathos of the heart and transform us into Jesus by grace. Friendship with him is the way. Through faith and hope in his gracious love for us, and our love for him, the human heart gradually recovers from the pathological condition of the fall. Slowly do the eyes of the heart recover their spiritual sight.... Slowly do we become the person God created us to be in the communion of the
